Introduction

This second semester of Samoan language and culture is designed to continue where Samoan 101 ended. Classroom activities will again stress conversation in Samoan, but exercises will also include reading, writing and grammar.

Student Learning Objectives

Upon successful completion of SAM 102, the student should be able to:

- Form basic sentences related to self, family, and daily contexts
- Form general descriptions of people, places, things and events.
- Respond to questions using the correct tenses and registers.
- Express feelings and emotional states in formal and informal contexts.
- Write properly formed sentences and brief compositions in Samoan, using basic vocabulary and proper orthography.
- Give and follow simple instructions/directions.
- Use idiomatic nuances and bodily gestures common to native speakers of Samoan.
- Compare and/or contrast Samoan culture to other cultures.

Course Requirements

Home Work Assignments will be due on the following day after they are assigned. No late Home Work Assignments will be accepted. There will be a mid-term exam and a final exam as well as a quiz every two weeks on the materials covered in that two week period. You may drop your lowest quiz score.

There will be a special class session each Tuesday in Moore 257 (Language Lab). The class will be repeated each hour from 9am until 12pm. Students may attend any of the 1-hour sessions. Please may sure that you sign in so that your attendance will be recorded. Students who have time conflicts or other obligations on Tuesday that prevent you from attending will be given a make-up assignment that will be due at the next class meeting (Wednesday).
